Grade 4 and 5: Pioneers and Explorers



- Chart age of Estate buildings and their purpose
- Create maps to show aspects of Fintry; land forms, bodies of water
- chart how land forms were used productively
- List economic activities of Fintry Estate
- Describe the power of water and how it was used.
- Sketch, draw, describe the Pelton Wheel for electricity generation and running a sawmill
- Sketch, draw describe the irrigation system.
- The Octagonal Barn; describe the benefits of this design.
- Sequence objects, images, events; and recognize the positive and negative changes from past to present.

Grade 4 and 5: Immigration & Multiculturalism



- Chart where capt. James Cameron Dun-Waters came from and those who worked for him on the estate.
- Describe what it might have been like for the Fairbridge Farm students coming from the UK to Fintry
- List what motivated explorers and settlers, like Dun-Waters, to come to Canada.
- Describe how Canada's identity has been shaped by the immigration of people from a wide range of cultural backgrounds.
- Describe the Labyrinth; its history and its significance.
